Course Descriptions

Practice Triage

Michael Pingree, MD

This course will present case studies that review important aspects of proper triage. Tips for proper risk assessment will also be discussed.

Doublemint Ain't the Only Way to Double Your Fun!

Paul Jeppsen, MD and Ryan McMurtrey, C.O.

This course will describe prisms and their use in measuring age alignment problems (strabismus).

The Tearing Patient

Steven Jackson, MD

This course will review patients with watery eye(s). A method will be taught for gathering and processing information, assessing and diagnosing the problem, and treating the condition.

The Ugly Eye

Dianna Graves, COMT, BS Ed

This course will discuss eye trauma and signs and symptoms of ocular diseases in regard to the "urgency". It will discuss why some problems are "not as bad as they look", whereas other "nonurgent" appearing eyes need immediate attention.

Five Things You Need to Know

Dianna Graves, COMT, BS Ed

This course will discuss the five areas that OMP must be proficient in: histories and visions, refraction pearls, pupils, checking anterior chamber depth, and people skills.

Tips to Improving the Evaluation and Testing of Patients

Scott Sykes, MD

This course will review the process of taking a patient history, documenting pertinent data, and examining patients.

New Advances in Glaucoma

Michael Lloyd, MD

This course will review new developments in the treatment of glaucoma. Attendees will be more familiar with endocyclophotocoagulation (ECP), canaloplasty, Trabectome, the Ex-PRESS minishunt, and the iStent as treatment options for glaucoma.

Eyelids: Evaluating, Testing, and Educating

Jed Poll, MD

This course will discuss various common eyelid malpositions and how they are approached clinically and surgically with major focus on patient education and evaluation.

Ophthalmology: A to Z

Adam Bowman, MD

This course will review the origins and meanings of common and uncommon words in ophthalmology.

Retina TechTraxSM

Retina TechTraxSM is a continuing education presentation on the topic of retinal vascular disease, particularly diabetic retinopathy and macular degeneration. Content includes epidemiology, symptoms, diagnosis, treatment, clinical trials, and low vision. The goal of this program is to better educate ophthalmic allied healthcare personnel, who in turn can better educate patients; thereby alleviating fear, increasing therapeutic compliance, and improving patient outcomes. This program will also include a hands on component with the Zeiss Cirrus-HD OCT Machine.
